





<u>Design Your own mask.</u>


- . Decorate your mask
- . Cut out masks and eye holes.
- Get some string/ribbon and measure around your head and cut.
- Attach each end of string/ribbon to back of mask with some sticky tape.











How to make your bird feeder:

Remove the lid from the squeeze bottle. Place the cotton ball inside the lid, and use a pencil or toothpick to push half of the cotton ball through the squeeze lid.

 The cotton ball will absorb some of the sugar water that will be inside the bottle, and allow the butterflies to drink it from outside the bottle.

Attach a rubber band to the opposite end of the squeeze bottle. Tie a piece of string to both sides of the rubber band to create a loop that can be hung on a tree limb.

• If the container is too heavy, you can use multiple rubber bands to reinforce the string.


Mix the water and sugar together until the sugar is completely dissolved. The mixture should be about 90% water and 10% sugar, depending on how much your bottle will hold. Fill the bottle halfway with the mixture, and reattach the lid with the cotton ball.



Decorate the outside of the bottle to be colorful and look like a flower. You may choose to paint the bottle, or attach fake or real flowers using glue or rubber bands.

Hang the feeder from a tree, and observe on sunny days for butterflies to enjoy the sugar water from the feeder.

(take care, scissors are sharp!). Make sure you leave a little ledge at the bottom. This will stop the marbles rolling out everywhere when they reach the end of the run.




the ends and cut a notch on one side for the marble to run through.




Next, take a little extra cardboard from another cereal box and fold the end of it and tape it onto the bottom. The folded end makes the marble run tilt back a little bit so the marble goes down the holes and doesn't fall out of the box.




Finally, tape the strips into the box and cut a little hole at the top to drop the marble through. Then go and find some marbles!






























Frog Hopper Origami
