## Education Week

Preschool is for children who will be turning 4 by the 31 July 2019 and who will be attending kindergarten in 2020.

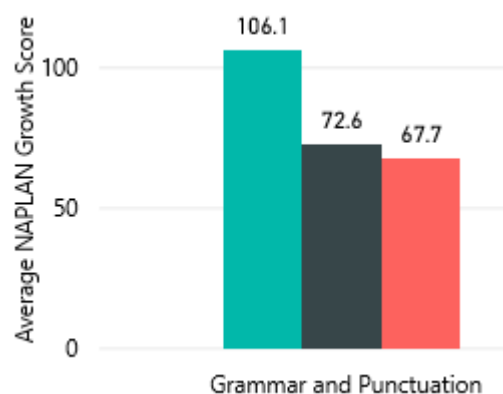
## Before school supervision

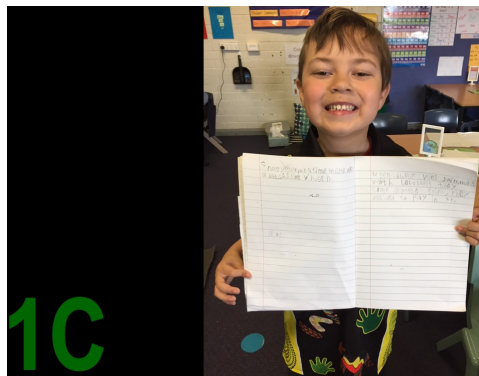
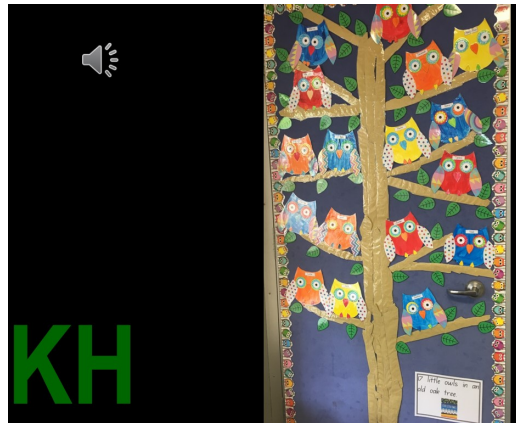
## NAPLAN results

Last week NAPLAN results were sent home to parents of students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across NSW. Each school uses these results to determine areas of strength within the school and areas in which we can specifically target teaching to enhance student outcomes. LPPS has a number of areas to recognise success, including significant gain on state levels in year 3 grammar, punctuation and numeracy.

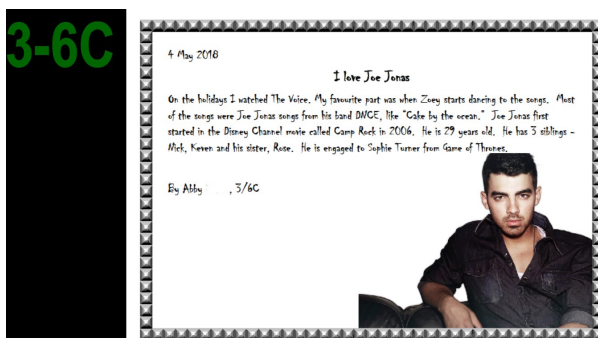
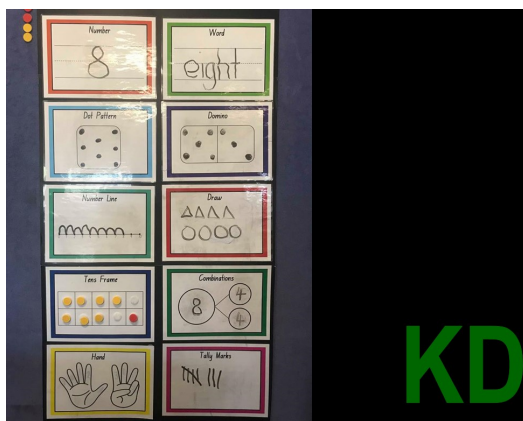
Our year 5 students showed growth greater than that of NSW in all measured areas, a reflection upon the increasingly strategic approach to teaching and learning. A particular highlight is shown below — the green represents LPPS growth, the black is similar schools and the pink is NSW. The LPPS score of 106.1 points growth has far outstripped by both similar schools and growth across all NSW students.

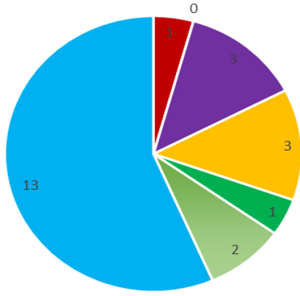

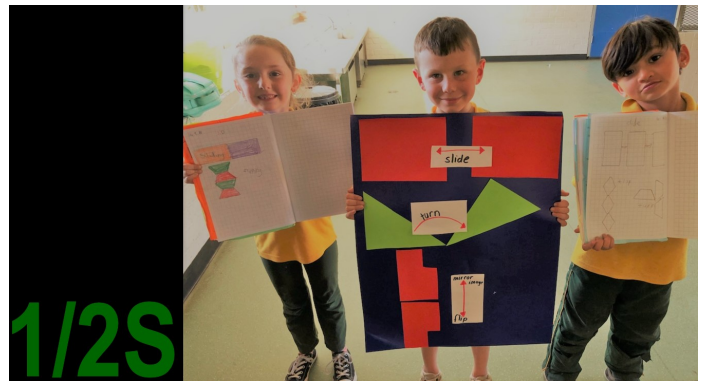

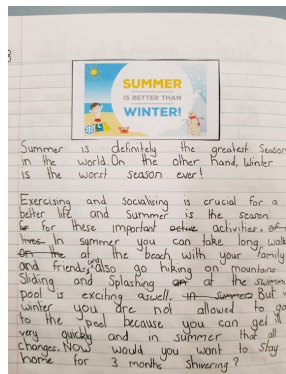
