#### **NAPLAN 2023**

Over the next 2 weeks (starting on Wednesday 15 March) our Year 3 and Year 5 eligible students will take part in the NAPLAN assessments. Students will participate in writing, reading, language conventions and numeracy assessments. These assessments provide the school with valuable data that is used to help identify strengths and areas for development. All parents of students participating will be provided with a comprehensive report of how your child has achieved in accordance with the school and state. Please remember that these assessments are a snapshot in time and does not necessarily relate to your child's overall learning progress. We encourage all eligible Year 3 and 5 students to do their best.

### 3 Way Goal Setting and Personalised Learning Pathways

Aligned to our Strategic Direction 3 – Connect, Succeed and Thrive, we aim to create an educationally connected school community. To help achieve this, over the last 2 weeks our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families, students, teachers and Aboriginal Education Officer have been meeting to inform Personalised Learning Pathways by collaboratively creating literacy, numeracy and cultural goals. Our students and families will now work in partnerships to achieve these identified goals. In Term 2, we are planning a Yarn Up afternoon to celebrate the progress that our students are making, as well as celebrate and communicate the Aboriginal programs on offer.

In addition, this week we are holding our 3 Way Goal Setting meetings. These meetings are being held in the school hall between the hours of 2pm and 5pm every afternoon. The goals students are working towards are aligned to reading, writing and numeracy data that is collected and analysed on a 5-weekly basis. These meetings will be led by your child – with some support. If you have not made an appointment with your child's teacher, it is not too late. ### Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

PBL is a whole school, student-centred system designed to motivate and encourage positive behaviour. Our students are taught how to be safe, be respectful and be a learner in all areas of the school and are encouraged to follow school expectations and criteria. This system is linked to our Badge assemblies and student selected Reward Days. Over the next few weeks, we will be reviewing this system, embedding students voice and presenting this back to interested families at a 'parent and carer consultation' meeting in the next few weeks.
