your classroom teacher, please contact our school office and request a call back.		
Should your child display any symptoms (e.g. headache, runny nose, cough, high		
temperature, vomiting, diarrhoea, etc.) that suggest they may be unwell, please		
keep them home from school. Call the school to inform the office or message the		
teacher using Seesaw. If your child displays any signs of illness at school, the school		
office will contact you to arrange for them to be collected. If your child has even		
mild COVID 19 symptoms, they should be tested and clear of all symptoms before		
returning to school.
